Aberfield is an improved alternative to traditional crossing sires. Producing efficient, profitable, replacement ewes and well conformed, fast growing wether lambs.



ABERMAX

Derived from the best Texel and Charollais genetics to produce a powerful meat ram. Bred for prime lamb production, the breeding programme focuses on lambing ease and lamb vigour, improved lamb growth and finished lamb conformation.



ABERBLACK

Bred from specific Suffolk lines with introgression of other important traits from Texel and Charollais.

The breeding programme is focused on rams that produce easy lambing, vigorous lambs that are very fast growing, and well conformed from forage diets. Ideal for outdoor lambing systems.

All rams are performance recorded and reared in commercial conditions, on grass and forage only.

Each animal is health screened for the main production limiting diseases and are certified with a negative Borders Disease PI status.

All rams purchased at the live sale must be paid for in full and moved on the day of purchase. Estates, Colleges or Businesses unable to accommodate this should notify our finance department in advance of the sale by email to **accounts@innovis.org.uk** or phone **01970 828236**.

Remote buyers will have 48 hours to contact the office to pay and arrange delivery/ collection. Reasonable delivery charges may be incurred depending on milage and logistics.

Any queries over accounts must be addressed pre or post the event.

All rams are sold in accordance with the Innovis Terms and Conditions for supply of goods and services, available to view on our website at www.innovis.org.uk

Innovis will guarantee the performance of all rams sold at its official sales for the first mating season after purchase, provided that the owner can demonstrate that they have made reasonable efforts to ensure the health, welfare and security of the ram during that period.

Any issues post sale must be raised prior to **1st February 2027** and accompanied by appropriate evidence/supporting documentation in addition to a veterinary report where applicable. In the event that a ram is found to be defective, a replacement ram of equivalent genetic potential will be supplied. A credit note for the value of the ram may be issued against the buyers next purchase if the replacement is not available. **No cash refunds are given.**

BLUETONGUE

Bluetongue is now well established in England, Wales and Northern Ireland with cases emerging recently in Scotland too. The potential impact on UK flocks has been widely discussed in the farming press and social media with many commercial flocks in south west England experiencing severe losses.

We do know that if a sheep is infected the disease is severe and very often fatal. Breeding rams are the most valuable animals in the flock and a big financial investment, Innovis vaccinated all breeding rams in 2025 & 2026, to provide maximum protection against BTV-3 before sale.

All rams will be sold with an accompanying health declaration document which details all vaccines the ram has received, including BTV-3. The BTV-3 vaccines currently available are anticipated to provide protection for approximately 1 year so buyers should consult their vet to discuss booster vaccinations next year as part of their annual health planning.

GENETIC UPGRADE VOUCHER

Here at Innovis we work hard to make sure we are constantly improving the genetics we offer to our customers so that our flock performance can continue to improve. For the rams we offer for sale this means that the average index and threshold to qualify as an Elite grade (Top 25%) gets higher each year.

Once again this year we are offering a Genetic Upgrade Voucher to customers who have a live Innovis ram **born on or before 2021**.

Terms & Conditions:

- Vouchers must be claimed **before 5pm on Tuesday 22nd September** to redeem your voucher at this sale.
- One voucher to be offered per live ram e.g., a customer who bought 3 x 2021 born rams can receive 3 x £50 vouchers.
- Each voucher can only be used on one ram e.g., a customer receiving 3 x £50 vouchers must purchase 3 new rams to be able to use all 3 vouchers.
- Each voucher must only be redeemed when buying an Elite or a Select grade ram.
- Vouchers must be used in the same year as when it is received, it will expire at the end of the year.

Please note:

No vouchers can be issued on the day of the sale. If you have qualifying rams, please ensure that all vouchers have been redeemed prior to the date above.

Health Protocol

Innovis understand that when selecting sheep for breeding, health is vitally important in order to protect the productivity of your flock. Therefore, we operate a unique programme to maximize health and biosecurity of our whole ram production system, from the source flocks, through to growing units and finally the rams for sale.

All breeding partner flocks are part of a health screening programme where ewes are blood sampled and some culled and screened for the major production limiting iceberg diseases through a partnership with 'Farm Post Mortems'. Further strategic screening is undertaken throughout the year and tailored flock health plans ensure that all ram lambs have had a similar start to life.

The five main Iceberg diseases:

Maedi Visna (MV)

Our breeding partner flocks are either MV accredited with PSGHS or monitored on a proportional testing programme in line with the MV accreditation scheme but operated by Innovis. Please contact our office if you specifically want MV accredited (PSGHS) stock. Innovis would implement a test and cull protocol across the whole flock if one of our breeding flocks tested positive for MV until two clear tests were achieved.

Borders Disease

In a ground-breaking initiative for our Sheep Industry, each ram has been bled and certified as Borders Disease (PI) Negative. Any PI positive ram would be culled albeit that none have been identified since we started testing in 2017.

Caseous lymphadenitis (CLA)

All our breeding flocks are monitored for CLA and any suspect abscesses on rams tested. Vaccination would be introduced if a flock were identified with CLA.

Ovine pulmonary adenocarcinoma (OPA)

As there is no robust validated test, we monitor condition score of ewes on a regular basis and post-mortem fallen stock or any ill-thrift animals where possible. We are actively involved in trying to develop a more robust approach to diagnosis and screening.

Johnes Disease

All retained ram lambs are vaccinated with 'Gudair' vaccine before five months of age, irrespective of the flock Johnes status, to safeguard their working life to customers. We also monitor for Johnes disease at multiplier flock level annually through faecal samples and post-mortem reports.

Ram lambs move on to grower units, selected for good biosecurity and management systems - each farm runs a grass and forage-based system and has a tailored health plan, meaning that each ram for sale is grown under similar conditions.

Finally, to ensure our rams are fit for purpose, each ram undergoes a pre-sale MOT to examine its suitability for breeding. This includes a clinical examination together with palpation and visual inspection of the external genitalia. Rams will leave our sales having had a quarantine drench of either 4-AD = Monepantel (Zolvix™) or 5-SI = Derquantel / abamectin (Startect™) in line with SCOPS guidelines. The rams will have also received a trace element bolus and Pasteurella vaccination booster pre-sale.

Sheep Scab - rams will have either been screened for exposure to Scab (*Psoroptes ovis* antibody ELISA test) at a group level or treated with a 2% Moxidectin injection at 1mg moxidectin/kg bodyweight pre-sale.

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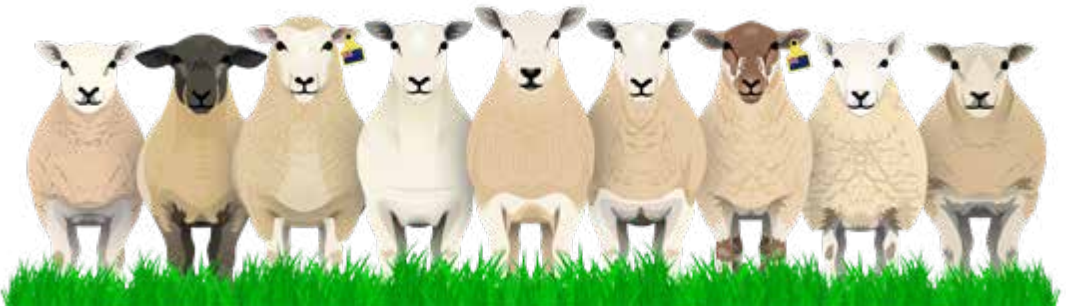

About the Group

Hill farming is crucial to the economy, culture and society of rural Wales. To sustain these areas, this group of progressive hill ram breeders are working to strengthen the Welsh sheep sector.

The ProHill group (previously the Welsh Mountain Breeding Group) are improving the genetic merit of their flocks and continuing to improve the viability of their own, and their customers' hill farms. Initial work was undertaken by five flocks that have recorded performance for a number of years with the number of members increasing following the HCC Hill Ram Scheme. We are pleased that the progress made was continued with the support of the Farming Connect for 3 years and is still being supported now through HCC's Welsh Sheep Genetics.

Performance Recording and Genetic Improvement

Using the latest technology available, the group record their sheep in commercially managed hill flocks. Data gathered is sent to Signet to calculate the Hill Index - an overall score that balances breeding values for maternal ability and carcase traits, that can be used as a tool to identify the best performing sheep and monitor progress. This has advanced further with the introduction of a genomic index, based on DNA information as well as conventional performance data.

The results are rams proven to perform, siring lambs that meet market requirements and replacement ewes with improved maternal ability for UK hill farmers.

For the 14th year running, the sale offers purchasers a selection of high index Signet recorded rams from this group of progressive breeders. These tups have established a reputation for quality and performance; all those offered for sale will have figures placing them in the top 50% of the breed.

In the biggest collaborative breeding project of its kind in Wales, Welsh hill sheep producers from different parts of the country have joined forces to raise the commercial standard of the regional types of hill sheep. The aim is to supply purebred, high index rams that will:

- Produce earlier finishing lambs
- Improve carcase weights and grades
- Breed flock replacements with exceptional maternal ability

The tups offered for sale are all assessed using the Hill Index which identifies sheep with superior breeding potential for maternal ability, lamb growth and carcase quality. The index encompasses two breeding targets, which are weighted equally:

Maternal Traits:

- Lambing percentages
 - Maternal ability
- Mature ewe size

Carcase Traits:

- 8 week & 20 week weights
- Muscle & backfat scanning

Welsh Mountain rams will be available from the following breeders who are selling rams at the 2026 sale. Brecknock Hill Cheviots, North Country Cheviots and Charmoise Hill rams will also be offered at the sale.

**** INDICATES VENDORS WITH BLUETOUGE-VACCINATED RAMS**

Rhidian Glyn is based near Machynlleth and keeps 800 Welsh ewes, 300 of which are performance recorded and bred pure to produce replacements. All ewes are lambed outdoors and have not received hard feed for the last 4 years. Rhidian has also successfully established a market for crossbred ewes from his flock that provide extra income to the business. Slaughter lambs are finished at a minimum of 16kg DW and average 18kgs.

Grass production is also seen as an important aspect of the farm and rams bred for sale will be reared on a grass-based system.

"I am hoping to improve ewe efficiency as a result of the scheme. It will mean stronger performers and their progeny can be easily identified, and just as importantly the bottom performers can be pulled from the breeding nucleus."

"Through the scheme I will identify the top 25% breeding ewes in my flock and in time this will trickle through to the cross-breed ewes I sell by continuously improving my whole flock average performance."

****Simon & Rhodri Lloyd Williams** - Moelgolomen, near Aberystwyth, run a flock of 720 ewes, all of which have been performance recorded for the past 20 years. More than half of the farm is made up of unimproved hill pasture, therefore keeping a hardy ewe which can produce lambs from a sustainable, low input system is crucial. The flock is run commercially and lambed outside, replacement ewes are all home-bred with only breeding rams bought in. Draft ewes and surplus ewe lambs are sold off farm, and yearling rams sold annually at the Welsh Mountain sale at Aberystwyth.

They focus strongly on maximising performance from grass alone. Non-breeding lambs are sold fat, with selection focused on faster finishing and improved conformation while maintaining ewe size and efficiency. Therefore, selection for lamb growth, muscle depth and carcass conformation ties in with maternal selection in the females for lamb growth and survival.

Over winter, the conditions on the hill mean that good fat cover and Body Condition Score is essential, improving ewe survival over winter and ensuring good milking ability in spring and subsequently improving lamb survival. They have also found that the lambing percentage has increased as a result although they have not specifically selected for a higher twin rate.

By joining the ProHill group, the Lloyd-Williams family will identify animals in the flock that are consistently performing well in the traits most relevant to them. They are striving to achieve flock improvement and efficiency, improving the quality of their environment and economically sustainable lamb.

****Carys Jones** farms in partnership with her family in the Brecon Beacons National Park with common grazing rights on the black mountain, farming 550 Improved Welsh ewes, with 150 breeding replacements. The main flock of 300 ewes is mated to breed replacement for the flock.

Ewe lambs are mated to a Charmoise ram for one cycle, and the remaining ewes are mated by a terminal sire.

For Carys, breeding for maternal traits and the ability to finish lambs off grass is crucial to the system. Her aim is to improve the performance of the flock by selectively breeding from ewes that perform well only. Performance recording has helped identify top-performing ewes for future replacements, with a focus on reducing costs and maximising output.

****Garry Williams**, Blaencennen, runs 700 Improved Welsh Mountain ewes on the Black Mountain, west of the Brecon Beacons. Ranging from 850ft to 1100ft above sea level, the farm is 285 acres, as well as consisting of common grazing rights on the mountain.

Although the farm crosses performance-recorded terminal and maternal sires over a proportion of their flock for various purposes, 250 ewes are kept pure and performance recorded, forming a nucleus flock from which the farm breeds all replacement ewes. Garry has been performance recording the flock for 25 years and uses performance-recorded sheep as much as he can.

Ewe and lamb performance are of key importance to Garry's breeding, aiming to strike a balance between meat and maternal traits in his flock, producing replacement ewes that perform well and lambs that finish easily and to specification. The intention within the flock is to continue focusing on these key performance traits, to maintain the productivity and efficiency of his own flock and to pass these gains on to his returning ewe lamb customers.

****Tim and Dot Tyne** run 200 Improved Welsh ewes on severely disadvantaged ground on the north side of the Llŷn Peninsula. Ewes have been recorded since 2007, which has led to significant improvement in their quality. The initial focus for selection in the flock was on maternal trait EBVs, to raise the ewes' standards. Now that they are a more consistent type and are in the top 10% performing within the breed, overall index is considered when selecting replacements but with a strong focus still on maternal performance.

The main drive for breeding in the flock is on producing good female lines and breeding rams that give customers top-quality ewe lambs.

The farm system is forage-based, utilizing grazed grass and home-grown silage. Ewes do not receive hard feed and lambs are all grass-finished, meaning that data is collected in an unbiased way.

Every ewe lamb is retained until selection as shearlings, the best being retained as replacements in the flock and the rest sold as breeding stock to repeat customers. Male lambs are retained to assess their potential as breeding stock and the remainder sold through market. The Tynes aim to continue improving the genetic merit of the flock, making use of technology such as DNA parentage to make the recording process more efficient.

****Edward Williams** farms Upper Wenallt in the Brecon Beacons. The focus has always been on ewes that can live cheaply and perform well on home-grown grass and roots, looking for maternal traits of his ewes, firmly believing that a lamb with high performance potential is only beneficial if the maternal ability of the ewe allows the lamb to fulfil that potential.

The 400 ewe flock grazes from 750 to 1200ft above sea level and are mated by a variety of tups. The pure-bred Welsh flock is largely made up of ewes with an EBV in the top 25% for their breed on performance. Ewes with lower scores are mated to Abertex/Aberdale rams, with the female progeny kept and mated back to Beltex/Charmoise Hill rams.

These strict selection criteria for the pure-bred flock have seen well above-average ewes being used to breed the first-cross ewe and a marked increase in their performance because of this. Proof that increasing performance at one end has an effect of filtering right through the system.

The main objective for performance recording is to identify the passengers within the flock. The best performers quite often stand out but the poor performers can slip under the radar and drain away the gains made.

****Irwel Jones** Aberbranddu, is a farm with a keen focus on efficiency and driving profitability. They have managed a closed flock for over 40 years, only investing in replacement rams, breeding hardy and easy-to-manage maternal ewes. The entire flock lambs outdoors, and are managed in large groups in order to make a fair comparison of their performance.

The key focus of the farm's genetic selection is for ewes producing lambs from a grass-based system that are saleable as soon as possible, in addition to selling rams with performance figures.

"Keeping an eye on market requirements means my flock needs to consistently produce lambs above 16kg with an R conformation grade or better as quickly and efficiently as possible. I take great pride in selling my rams at the local breed society sale in Tregaron and producing rams with EBVs will be an opportunity for my customers to have added assurance of my rams' performance".

Gareth Roberts' flock grazes Bardsey Island, located off the very tip of the Llyn Peninsula; it is home to a wide variety of wildlife, both land and sea, as well as a flock of Welsh hill ewes. Gareth Roberts and his wife, Meriel, have sought to join the Hill Ram scheme to improve its commercial performance in this unique environment and to expand in to ram selling.

The scheme will allow Mr Roberts to assess the physical performance of the ewes, identifying animals with superior maternal and carcase production traits within his flock and maximising them through breeding selection. As a result, he can select the right genetics within his flock and improve performance and efficiency without changing their surroundings.

Hywel Wigley - The land at Llwyngwern Farm in Gwynedd rises from 600 to 2000ft above sea level and as a result, selecting and breeding from ewes that perform well is key in this flock of 300 Hardy Welsh ewes.

The flock has been performance recorded since 1995 with maternal ability and muscle depth being two of the main traits Mr Wigley selects for.

Due to the nature of the land, a 115% lambing percentage is aimed for. Single rearing ewes are out-wintered and lambed outside on the lower parts of the mountain and hill with no supplementary feed. Twin ewes are lambed indoors due to a recent problem with fox predation.

****Iwan Davies** of Maety Isaf, located in the Brecon Beacons, farms on the uplands of the National Park. He started performance recording in 2023 and became a new member of ProHill this year.

His flock consists of 480 breeding ewes and around 120 replacements, with the main ewe breed being the Brecknock Hill Cheviot, targeting a mature ewe weight of 60kg. Around 350 to 380 Cheviot ewes are mated to Cheviot rams, with the remainder crossed to Bluefaced Leicester or Suffolk rams.

The flock currently scans at around 110%, with ambitions to increase this further. Iwan focuses on maternal ability, lamb survival and growth, aiming to produce a high-performing, functional ewe. When selecting rams, he selects on type first before using EBVs to support his final breeding decisions.

Lambs are finished for the Taste the Difference scheme with Dunbia, while some Mule lambs are retained or sold as breeding females. In addition to the sheep enterprise, Iwan runs 12 pedigree Hereford cattle, with all beef sold through direct meat sales alongside pork and some lamb.

Arwyn Williams began farming at Hendre Nantcyll in 2000. The farm extends to 500 acres, two-thirds of which is rented, with 70% of the land allocated to rough grazing. For the past 5 years, he has been purchasing rams from the ProHill sale while also breeding and selling his own rams from the farm.

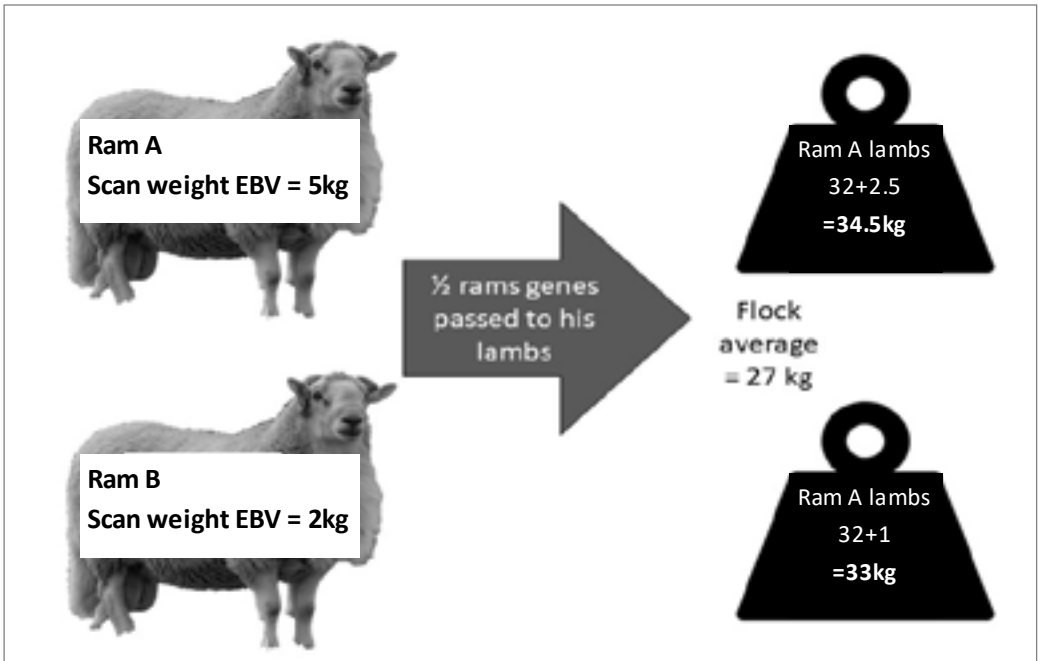
Arwyn runs a flock of 460 sheep, including 120 ewe lamb replacements. The flock consists of 250 ProHill ewes, 100 Aberblack-cross ewes, and 110 Aberdale × Primera-cross ewes. His aim is to achieve a scanning percentage of 145%, with outdoor lambing taking place in April.

A herd of 25 Limousin-cross cows, bred to a Charolais bull, is also kept at Hendre Nantcyll. The herd calves in the spring, with store cattle sold at 17 to 18 months of age.

Interpreting the EBVs

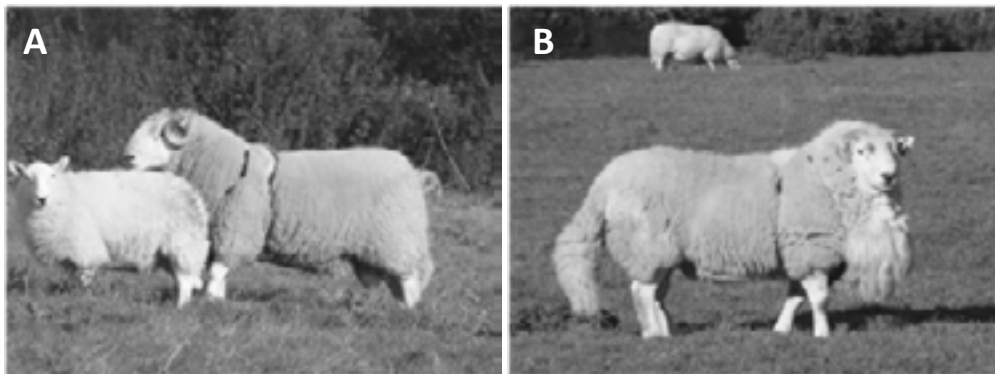
EBVs indicate how the progeny of a ram is likely to perform. For example:

- A ram with an EBV of +6 for scan weight is estimated to have the genetic potential to be 6kg heavier at 20/21 weeks compared to one with an EBV of 0.
- A recorded ram will only pass on half of its genes to its lambs so its EBVs must be halved in order to estimate the average genetic worth of its progeny.



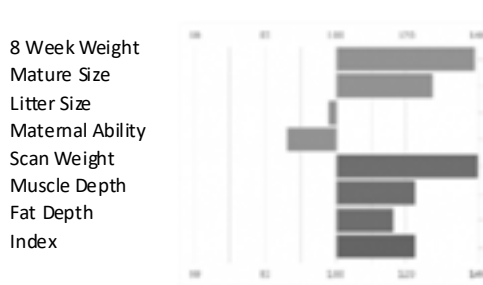
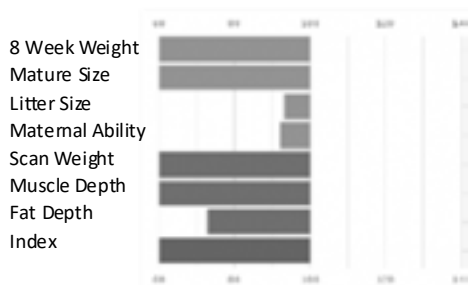

These two rams are a very similar type and were both purchased for four-figure sums and unrecorded at the time of purchase.



After joining a performance recorded flock, EBVs were calculated from the performance of the rams progeny. Ram A's lambs were mainly sold as store lambs and failed to make any significant growth.

In comparison ram B produced fast finishing lambs that graded well. Ram A's EBVs were found to be below average on most traits, ram B's however have been proven above average for most traits, as shown below.

What is performance recording?

Ewes and lambs in hill flocks are individually monitored and key indicators of commercially significant traits are recorded. The data is then analysed and the EBVs and Indexes that are the outcome, are a prediction of how progeny will perform which in turn can impact on your profits.

To calculate the EBVs, Prohill breeders are recording

- flock mating information and pre-tupping weights
- scanning results
- lambing ease and vigour
- 8 week weights
- backfat scanning at 20 weeks.

The data is analysed and used to create the Welsh Index which identifies sheep with superior breeding potential for meat and maternal traits, predicting the value of each ram to your flock. Since June 2023 the Index is expressed as the expected annual return per ewe in ££.

You can use the estimated breeding values to pick rams that will improve the performance of their lambs and their daughters that come in to your flock.

Individual EBVs are expressed in the same units as the recorded trait (e.g. kg for eight week weight) and they relate to a common baseline. This baseline of zero relates to the average breeding value of lambs born in the year in 2015.
